Laurie Thompson and Tyler Smith were in attendance to update Council on the meeting held at Jocelyn Hall on January 5, 2023. It was acknowledged that the purpose of the meeting, to provide recommendations to Council on the vision of an access point to the south side of Otter Lake, was not fully addressed and however, it was Ms. Thompson's statement that the consensus of the group was that until further information was available, the existing access from P Line to Otter Lake was the desired option. And if the committee recommendation was unworkable for Council, those ratepayers would like an explanation why and be involved in providing recommendations for the next step. Mr. Smith did not concur with Ms. Thompson's outcome statement, as the group did not provide a vision for access from Otter Lake Road to Otter Lake.

For clarification, Option 2 was an access point to Otter Lake from Otter Lake Road, on the west side of the existing culvert located on Otter Lake Road. Option 3 was an access point to Otter Lake from Otter Lake Road, on the east side of the existing culvert located on Otter Lake Road.

Council and ratepayers in attendance had an extensive discussion. Additional correspondence was received prior to the meeting regarding the access to the south side of Otter Lake. (See Information Correspondence – addendum)

WHEREAS on October 25, 2022, the Provincial government introduced Bill 23 known as the "More Homes Built Faster Act, 2022";

AND WHEREAS the overall stated purpose of Bill 23 is to introduce several legislative changes to increase housing supply throughout Ontario and to achieve the province's goal of 1.5 million homes over the next ten years;

AND WHEREAS the proposed changes include significant changes to six pieces of legislation including but not limited to development charges reform, diminished role of conservation authorities, removal of legislated planning responsibilities from some upper-tier municipalities, removal of public consultation in relation to subdivisions, adjusting the rights of appeal by third parties, and adjusting how growth-related capital infrastructure is paid for;

AND WHEREAS given the enormity of the proposed changes and potential long-term financial impacts to municipalities, including Jocelyn Township, additional time, further to the amendment to January 15, is needed to review, engage, and analyze the proposal to provide informed feedback.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Township of Jocelyn formally requests the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing extend the commenting period for all components of the proposed Bill 23 to allow for a more informed consultation period.
- 2. That the Township of Jocelyn submit a letter to the Ontario Minister of Municipal and Affairs MP, and local MPP, expressing concerns with the proposed legislation
