



The median or typical property in each group represents a property with an assessed value at or near the midpoint or median for the group. Noted below are the percent increases by group.

Median property tax impacts in Jocelyn Township are as follows:

- Single family homes - 1.87% increase
- Seasonal Recreation Dwelling – 2.75% increase
- Farm House – 12.66% increase
- Farmland – 15.54 % increase
- Managed Forest – 15.27 % increase

The Median property tax impacts are calculated through Ontario Property Tax Analysis, also known as OPTA, a program funded by the Ministry of Finance and operated by Reamined Systems.

Roads capital project included in this year's budget include resurfacing the K Line (from Highway 548 to Sunset Point) and completing the P Line Hill Guide Rail Project.

The budget for 2018 will be adopted at the May 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of Council.

Committee reports were discussed.
